

Scripture Readings (ESV):

I Peter 4:7-11:

⁷ The end of all things is at hand; therefore be self-controlled and sober-minded for the sake of your prayers. ⁸ Above all, keep loving one another earnestly, since love covers a multitude of sins. ⁹ Show hospitality to one another without grumbling. ¹⁰ As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace: ¹¹ whoever speaks, as one who speaks oracles of God; whoever serves, as one who serves by the strength that God supplies—in order that in everything God may be glorified through Jesus Christ. To Him belong glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen.

Matthew 26:30-46:

³⁰ And when they had sung a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives. 31 Then Jesus said to them, "You will all fall away because of Me this night. For it is written, 'I will strike the shepherd, and the sheep of the flock will be scattered.' 32 But after I am raised up, I will go before you to Galilee." ³³ Peter answered Him, "Though they all fall away because of You, I will never fall away." 34 Jesus said to him, "Truly, I tell you, this very night, before the rooster crows, you will deny Me three times." 35 Peter said to Him, "Even if I must die with You, I will not deny You!" And all the disciples said the same. ³⁶ Then Jesus went with them to a place called Gethsemane, and He said to His disciples, "Sit here, while I go over there and pray." ³⁷ And taking with Him Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, He began to be sorrowful and troubled. ³⁸ Then He said to them, "My soul is very sorrowful, even to death; remain here, and watch with Me." ³⁹ And going a little farther He fell on His face and prayed, saying, "My Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from Me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as You will." ⁴⁰ And He came to the disciples and found them sleeping. And He said to Peter, "So, could you not watch with Me one hour? 41 Watch and pray that you may not enter into temptation. The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak." ⁴² Again, for the second time, He went away and prayed, "My Father, if this cannot pass unless I drink it, Your will be

done." ⁴³ And again He came and found them sleeping, for their eyes were heavy. ⁴⁴ So, leaving them again, He went away and prayed for the third time, saying the same words again. ⁴⁵ Then He came to the disciples and said to them, "Sleep and take your rest later on. See, the hour is at hand, and the Son of Man is betrayed into the hands of sinners. ⁴⁶ Rise, let us be going; see, My betrayer is at hand."

Sermon: **No Matter What**

1.	How does Peter command that we respond when all things are coming to an end (I Peter 4:7-11)? What is something you commit to doing to fulfill this in the next few weeks?
2.	How does Jesus demonstrate love for God and love for neighbor in the Gospel lesson? How are the two woven together? How can you love your neighbor and God in these days?
3.	Where is your faith today? Is it filled with bravado like Peter's (Matthew 26:33-35)? Or are you willing to remain diligently in prayer with Jesus through the long, dark night?
4.	Are you willing to submit to the Father's will as Jesus did? Will you pray what Jesus prayed? How will you live out that call to humble service?
