

Scripture Readings (ESV):

Daniel 6:16-18:

¹⁶ Then the king commanded, and Daniel was brought and cast into the den of lions. The king declared to Daniel, "May your God, whom you serve continually, deliver you!" ¹⁷ And a stone was brought and laid on the mouth of the den, and the king sealed it with his own signet and with the signet of his lords, that nothing might be changed concerning Daniel. ¹⁸ Then the king went to his palace and spent the night fasting; no diversions were brought to him, and sleep fled from him.

Matthew 27:57-66:

⁵⁷ When it was evening, there came a rich man from Arimathea, named Joseph, who also was a disciple of Jesus. ⁵⁸ He went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Then Pilate ordered it to be given to him. ⁵⁹ And Joseph took the body and wrapped it in a clean linen shroud ⁶⁰ and laid it in his own new tomb, which he had cut in the rock. And he rolled a great stone to the entrance of the tomb and went away. ⁶¹ Mary Magdalene and the other Mary were there, sitting opposite the tomb.

⁶² The next day, that is, after the day of Preparation, the chief priests and the Pharisees gathered before Pilate ⁶³ and said, "Sir, we remember how that impostor said, while He was still alive, 'After three days I will rise.' ⁶⁴ Therefore order the tomb to be made secure until the third day, lest His disciples go and steal Him away and tell the people, 'He has risen from the dead,' and the last fraud will be worse than the first." ⁶⁵ Pilate said to them, "You have a guard of soldiers. Go, make it as secure as you can." ⁶⁶ So they went and made the tomb secure by sealing the stone and setting a guard.

Scripture: Daniel 6:16-18; Matthew 27:57-66

	Sermon: Laid Low and Still
1.	How does the Daniel in the lions' den parallel Jesus' experience in the grave? How have you experienced being in the valley of the shadow of death (Psalm 23:4) in these days?
2.	Contrast Joseph of Armithea and the chief priests and Pharisees before Pilate. How did they behave? What motivated their behavior? Who was their model for this behavior?
3.	In Matthew 27:61 , we are told that two of the Marys sat opposite the tomb. What are you sitting and praying for as we wait to return to normal and a time we can engage fully in the life and ministry of the Church?
4.	As we are lying low and still in these socially distanced times, how is God shaping your heart and soul for future service when our doors open wide just as the stone was rolled away for Jesus in the

Resurrection? [These days are mini-rest akin to Christ lying low and

still in the grave.]


Worship Time Change: Starting in October, the worship time will begin at 10am.
